IHF Success Story - The Tribal Peace Farm, Kenya, Africa

IHF established an orphanage and started to farm on approximately 14 acres of fertile land in the Nakuru region, Rift Valley, Kenya as a long term solution against famine brought on by drought, which resulted in deadly tribal conflict over water rights and food sources in the region.

IHF currently cares for a total of 130 orphans in the Nakuru region. This number is growing as a result of the above. In November 2007, our volunteers and children began to farm 5 acres of the orphanage's land, aiming to become self sufficient.

The first produce was picked on January 2008. With the farming and distribution of produce done by volunteers and staff from four different tribes, who shared both work and produce, the foundation for peace was established, and "The Tribal Peace Farm" came into existence.

When more funding becomes available, IHF plans to farm most of the 14 acres, so that not only could we provide food for the orphans, we could donate the surplus produce to the Pokot tribes, whose members are on our Famine Feed Drive. The famine feed drive is a necessity because it helps assuage the starvation in the area. These famine feed drives cost an average of US\$750.00 per month (indexed for inflation), with each feeding over 1,000 nomadic people, the poorest in the desert areas.

Unfortunately, after walking for days to come for food, there are times the food supplies ran out with still a long line of hungry people and children waiting ... It is most difficult and unbearable for those who witness this situation to walk away and Not to do more ...

In light of the current world food crises and specifically the Kenya Famine, IHF understands that day to day famine feed is not the answer. **The solution is to generate sustainable food source at the local level. It is here that we are appealing to the world public for funding to expand this farming initiative.** IHF wants to plant the entire 14 acres of farmland so more local tribe members can become self sufficient. **This is a project where one could see / quantify results overtime, a most rewarding experience.**

IHF volunteers and staff also plan to include farming curriculum, a life-waving skill in the Rift Valley, as part of the education for the children.

As a grassroots non-profit organization, we have started on a very small scale with very limited funds. Yet already we have achieved the plantation of spinach, kale, cabbages, onions and tomatoes. With your generous support, the Peace Farm Project has the potential to save and better the lives of many.

Other IHF's programs:

1. Programs to educate, support, or sponsor an orphan(s);
2. Education programs in English, Mathematics and Computer literacy for children, who are otherwise too poor to go to school
3. Programs to distribute much needed medicine and vitamins to malnourished children

For over 20 years, Carol Sasaki, Founder of IHF, relied solely on her private funds and help from her dear friends, in the rescuing and hiding of children and women, who were victims of the sex slave industry. As absolute secrecy and privacy was critical to the protection of the lives of the children and women, IHF received no public support. Now, as the number of children in need multiplied, Carol felt that it has reached a critical juncture to expose their poverty and plight, and to gain public support and funding

To avail IHF's programs for public support, to help more children and women, IHF became a US 501(c)3 non-profit organization. By creating connections amongst the children, volunteers and their sponsors, the founder believes that the volunteers and sponsors will, through interaction with the children, learn about poverty first hand, and will pass on what they learn to the people around them. Thus spreading understanding, compassion and assistance from the developed countries to the under developed world

Our uniqueness, starting from our founder, Carol Sasaki, is that IHF, a grassroots organization, operates almost completely on the work of volunteers so that the greatest amount of funding could be spent directly in serving vulnerable children and communities

IHF provides homes, medical care, education, and love to vulnerable children and orphans; educational opportunities to children in poverty, and strongly believes in equal opportunity for all. IHF also believes in preserving the cultures, traditions, and beliefs of the marginalized communities where it works. **IHF currently operates 4 orphanages in Thailand, Indonesia, and Kenya, and 5 educational centers in Indonesia and Kenya.
